# A Study on Feminist Perspectives and Gender Role Inverted in Film and Television Works: A Case Study of Anatomy of a Fall

This article focuses on the film *Anatomy of a Fall* directed by French director Justine Triet, exploring the feminist perspective and the phenomenon of traditional gender role inversion presented in the film. This independence is not only reflected in economic independence but also in spiritual self-fulfillment. Ueno Chizuko once said, "Women are a situation." Although gender is innate, women can still choose to achieve gender freedom. Not only do they need their own room in reality, but they also need their own fortress in spirit [3].

# 3.3 Female Subjectivity in Marriage

The film delves into the subjectivity of women in marriage through Sandra's perspective. In traditional marriage concepts, women are often seen as accessories to men, and their value and significance are usually limited to family and childbirth. However, Anatomy of a Fall breaks this tradition by swapping traditional male and female identities, showcasing women's independence and autonomy in marriage [4].

Sandra has made compromises for her family. The film also examines the phenomenon of gender role inversion from a social and legal perspective. When Sandra was investigated as a suspect, public opinion believed that she may be more likely to become a criminal due to certain "feminine" traits, such as strong emotions and emotional instability.

But Samuel's situation is a dilemma that many women are facing in reality, and society has long been accustomed to the invisible oppression of women. If the plot changes and the husband show emotional stability after his wife's death, the court is unlikely to suspect him of committing a crime. The fragility of women and the strength of men are both stereotypes in society, and the lack of fragility in women and the lack of strength in men are mostly not sins. As the director said, Sandra just did what every man would do.

# **5.** The Current Challenges and Future Development Suggestions of Feminist Film and Television Works

### **5.1 Existing Challenges**

# 5.1.1 Low Return on Investment

Film and television works are ultimately commodities, and as commodities, commercial interests are the most important consideration in their production and distribution. Feminist film and television works are difficult to achieve explosive success due to their limited audience. The classic film *The Devil Wears Prada*, which showcased the power of women from a female perspective earlier, grossed \$187 million worldwide. *The Hunger Games* 

series, which sparked a wave of female screen character reconstruction, grossed the highest box office at \$654 million. In 2023, Anatomy of a Fall, which won many international awards, grossed only \$39.248 million worldwide. Driven by commercial interests, some film and television work often choose popular themes that cater to market demand rather than profound social issues, which leads to insufficient funding and resources in the creation and distribution process of feminist film and television works. Without sufficient financial support, the quality of production and the scope of dissemination will be limited. If there is no original work as a basis, feminist films with original scripts, although profound in content and unique in perspective, usually can only attract attention on a small scale and it is difficult to achieve satisfactory box office results for investors.

# **5.1.2 Limitations of Traditional Gender Concepts**

Influenced by traditional social beliefs and gender stereotypes, feminist film and television works often encounter obstacles in the process of censorship and promotion, greatly limiting the market acceptance of the works. From the perspective of audience size and target customer group, the proportion of male audience is much lower than that of female audience, presenting a significant imbalance. This indicates that most men still lack interest and identification with film and television works that delve into feminism, and attracting a wider male audience is a direction that needs to be addressed. In recent years, although feminist film and television works have improved in both quantity and quality, there are still some viewers and critics who are accustomed to viewing female characters and feminist issues from a traditional perspective, making it difficult for works to gain widespread recognition and support. A small number of viewers even hold a resistant or exclusionary attitude, which undoubtedly further exacerbates the dilemma of feminist film and television works in the market.

### 5.2.1 Improving the Quality of Works

In order to enhance the market competitiveness and influence of feminist film and television works, the production quality of the works must be improved. This includes strengthening script creation, enhancing the professional competence of directors and actors, optimizing post-production, and particularly emphasizing the cultivation of female directors and screenwriters. The participation of female creators often allows feminist film and television work to vividly and authentically showcase the status and situation of women in modern society, thereby attracting

more audience attention and resonance. Director Li Yu's films often center around women, and her creative philosophy is to delve into the inner world of women, focus on their living conditions, and construct traditional gender concepts [7]. Director Li Yu has given female characters more initiative and choicer, and her works are worthy of reference for contemporary feminist film and television creators.

In terms of content creation, it is possible to enrich the types and styles of works, use more innovative and unique narrative methods and expressive techniques to tell the stories of women from different regions and cultural backgrounds, diversify the creative styles, and enhance the artistic quality and ideological depth of the works. The Hunger Games series can be said to have opened a new era of female character screen image construction, breaking down and reshaping traditional female screen images, and creating a new perspective, image, and position of women. The film also employs unique narrative techniques, flexibly switching between first-person and omniscient perspectives, highlighting themes of anti-male gaze and female subjectification [8].

### 5.2.2 Emphasize Publicity and Promotion

Firstly, it is necessary to broaden the channels of dissemination.
